Changes from 1 January 2025


- NRMM on all sites within Greater London will be required to meet Stage IV as a minimum.
- Central Activities Zone, Opportunity Areas and Greater London zones will no longer have different standards.
- The requirement for generators will continue to be Stage V.

What you need to do before 1 January 2025

- **1** Log into your account on the NRMM website.
- 2 Review your NRMM register.



4 Continue to log all NRMM between 37kW – 560Kw.

Exemptions

If you can't source compliant NRMM or if you're using an engine which has been retrofitted with an emissions reduction system, you need to apply for an exemption.
