

Mechanics carry out servicing and repair activities on a wide range of construction plant, equipment and accessories, either in a workshop or on site. Activities include routine servicing, breakdowns, fitting additional equipment or carrying out repairs to damaged equipment.

SPOTLIGHT ON BETHAN WHITTAKER

NATIONAL PLANT MECHANIC OF THE YEAR 2024

When the Stars of the Future judges saw the lengths that Bethan had gone to in her nomination for Plant Mechanic of the Year, they were unanimous that not only should she win the regional accolade for Wales, but she should also win the National Plant Mechanic of the Year Award.

It was one of the first times that the judges had received a personal statement filmed using TikTok, but she didn't stop there. She accompanied it with an impressive 1,000 word write-up telling her story about how she entered into the plant sector.

When Bethan first left school and college, she was on a very different career path to the one she's on now. With a keen interest in sport, she completed an Honours Degree in Sports Conditioning, Rehabilitation and Massage at Cardiff Metropolitan University. Before that she achieved Coleg y Cymoedd's first ever triple Distinction star for completing her BTEC Level 3 Award.

Bethan is a talented rugby player and has played for several teams including Bargoed RFC and Nelson RFC, being awarded numerous representations for Nelson's senior women's first team and also completing pitch side physio. However, after she completed her university degree, she deliberated on her career path moving forward and decided against the sporting route.

Instead, she decided to focus on her other interest of mechanics. Bethan has always been a practical, hands-on type of person with a keen interest in the plant industry; as a child she always played with machine toys and she took many a trip to watch machinery in action such as excavators and dump trucks on building sites. But despite her deep interest, she initially found it difficult to get a foot in the door.

She said: "It was a hard path to get anyone to offer me a chance within the industry, not only because of my gender, but having to face many companies turning me away due to me being female and them being unsure if I could handle being in a very male dominated environment.



"Finally, to get into the industry I accepted a job offer as a 3T flatbed driver for Fitzgerald Plant Services. I completed this role for numerous months, using the time to build relationships and prove myself in other aspects aside from the driving."

Bethan put in hours of overtime helping out in the workshop to prove her interest and skills. After many months of expressing an interest in working full-time in the workshop, she was given the chance and worked alongside an excellent mentor for 18 months, developing her skills set along the way.

She then progressed to KJ Services in a job that was closer to home, successfully completing an initial trial period to prove herself within the workshop and on-site environments, and becoming an excellent ambassador for the company over time.

Bethan hopes to work abroad in the future, in either Australia or Canada to allow her to gain even more experience of working on larger mining plant equipment. She also has aspirations to complete teaching qualifications in order to share her knowledge with the next generation of aspiring Plant Mechanics.

WHAT IS A **PLANT TECHNICIAN?**

Technicians carry out more complex technical repairs than Plant Mechanics and require a higher level of understanding on the principles and workings of key components and functional equipment. They deal with complex breakdowns, upgrades or conversions.



SPOTLIGHT ON MORGAN WARDLE

NATIONAL PLANT TECHNICIAN OF THE YEAR 2024

Morgan originally joined Banks Plant Solutions in Durham on a placement that helped young people to get into work. He has already worked himself up from a Labourer to a qualified Plant Mechanic.

His first experience of the plant-hire sector was when he was at school, as Morgan's Dad was a Plant Manager for a plant-hire company and Morgan worked with him over the weekends. He originally started with Banks Plant Solutions on a Government work placement which enabled him to get a construction qualification, and his peers were so impressed with his work ethic that they made the decision to take him on as a Labourer in a full-time position.

Morgan, now 23, continually delivered to outstanding levels and built excellent working relationships across the business, which prompted Banks Plant Solutions to invest in Morgan's development to work towards an apprenticeship in Plant Mechanics.

He said: "When I first left school, I never got the opportunity to start an apprenticeship, so when the opportunity arose, my Manager and colleagues told me I should 100% apply. It's been one of the best decisions I've ever made. I've learnt so much and can take on complicated tasks that I never thought I could do. The best thing about my job is that I learn from time served Plant Mechanics and gain their knowledge which they pass down to me."

During his time at Banks Plant Solutions, Morgan has gone above and beyond with his learning and has completed numerous extra training courses such as Quarry Passport, Gas Safety Training, Health and Safety for Operatives and has multiple machines on his NPORS which included additional NVQs.

Morgan first won an accolade at the CPA Stars of the Future Awards in 2023 when he was selected as Plant Mechanic of the Year for the Northern region. He went on to impress the judges even further at this year's awards when he won the National Plant Technician of the Year prize. "WHEN I FIRST LEFT SCHOOL, I NEVER GOT THE OPPORTUNITY TO START AN APPRENTICESHIP BUT IT'S BEEN ONE OF THE BEST DECISIONS I'VE EVER MADE."

He added: "I was so happy when I won. It showed me that my dedication and hard work had paid off. For my prize I won a roll cart full of Snap-on tools which was amazing. It will really help me throughout my career and remind me in many years to come about the day I won 'Star of the Future'."

So what's next for Morgan? He plans to keep on working hard and gain his NVQ Level 3 in Plant Mechanics. He hopes to move up through the ranks at Banks Plant Solutions and one day be running the plant sector as the Plant Director.

Best of luck Morgan - each and every one of the Stars of the Future judges were so impressed with your nomination and we have every confidence you can achieve your dreams.

SPOTLIGHT ON MILLIE SCOTT-YOU **HIRE CONTROLLER**

OF THE YEAR 2024

Since Millie, 19, joined Sunbelt Rentals as an Apprentice Customer Service Advisor in September 2022, she has made a huge impression company-wide thanks to her positive attitude and infectious personality.

Just a few months after starting work at Sunbelt Rentals' Chadderton depot in Greater Manchester, she won the 'Impressive Start Award' at the company's Annual Apprentice Awards and is widely seen as a source of inspiration - not just for her fellow apprentices and depot staff, but also for management.

When Millie first left school, she initially moved into the dental nursing profession, but with a strong family background in construction, when the apprenticeship opportunity at Sunbelt Rentals arose, she had no hesitation in swapping her medical scrubs for a hi-viz vest!

Millie's Dad is a Senior Construction Director and although there was never any pressure, she knew from his own views that there some were great opportunities for women in construction.

She told us: "When the Sunbelt Rentals apprenticeship was advertised locally, I felt drawn into making my own way. You could say follow in my Dad's footsteps, however, by my own pathway."

Millie's Dad has been a huge source of inspiration for her personally and professionally. He was actually diagnosed with cancer early on in Millie's apprenticeship journey, but she was determined to maintain a professional and positive attitude at work. At the age of 17, Millie was made her Dad's primary carer and they both firmly believe that the joy Millie's apprenticeship brought to them both helped with his full recovery.

Millie is carrying out her apprenticeship in conjunction with North Warwickshire and South Leicestershire College (NWSLC) and she believes it has equipped her with valuable skills, especially team-based problem solving, setting up a strong foundation for her future.

WHAT IS A LIFTING TECHNICIAN?

A Lifting Technician is someone who has the responsibility to set up and operate, to a high standard, either a tower, wheeled or crawler crane to lift and place materials and equipment to designated work areas on a construction site. They need to interpret and comply with given lift plan information and work in close proximity with the lifting team to carry out the lifting activities as well as undertaking slinger/signaller duties.



SPOTLIGHT ON ZAC BRADSHAW LIFTING TECHNICIAN OF THE YEAR 2024

Before Zac started working at Commhoist, he previously worked in the hospitality industry but he was keen to change his career path and start something afresh. An old school friend of Zac's had worked at Commhoist for several years and first introduced him to the company.

When Zac, 27, first joined Commhoist, he worked as a van driver delivering equipment to site, but it was soon evident that he was keen to progress and was capable of so much more. Plant Installers assemble, commission and disassemble large items of plant such as cranes, hoists, tunnelling equipment, material processing equipment, etc. which are stored and transported in component form and built up and disassembled on site.

SPOTLIGHT ON STEVE GWYNN INDIVIDUAL APPRENTICE MENTOR

OF THE YEAR 2024

Steve has been a dedicated mentor since 2010, passionately advocating for and actively participating in the Sunbelt Rentals' apprenticeship programme.

Over the years, he has mentored six apprentices at Sunbelt Rentals, creating an environment where they can learn and grow. Steve first became interested in mechanics at the young age of 10 when he started working over the school holidays and weekends at a family run car, commercial and bus garage. SPOTLIGHT ON SHANNON WEISS

BEST PERSONAL STATEMENT AWARD WINNER 2024

Shannon, 29, first completed a college course in Construction and the Built Environment before searching for an apprenticeship. She had always enjoyed restoring classic cars, so when when an apprenticeship opportunity came up at Finning UK, she knew it was something that she would enjoy.

Based at Finning's Chesterfield branch which serves quarrying, aggregate and construction customers in the East Midlands and the Peak District, she has completed a three-year apprenticeship and is now a fully-fledged repair and rebuild Engineer with Finning UK.

She said: "Technical plant electrical has always been my passion since the start of my role. Being able to develop an understanding of machine systems and training with our plant electrical specialist has not only been invaluable to me, but also other Engineers in the workshop with their jobs.

"There's nothing better than taking an old run-down machine and rebuilding it to new. I love the variety of work and I put my heart and soul into every job I love it that much. One job you could be completely overhauling and restoring a Dozer, the next you're on-site working on a Crusher, the next you're out on a farm on a Mini Excavator and then you're rebuilding and setting up axles. You never know what your next job could be and even after three years it keeps it fresh.

"Finning has already offered me amazing opportunities leading my own self-directed work, working in construction and other sectors such as site-based mining, oil and gas, fishing and power systems. My ambitions are to continue to pursue passionate interests within the company whatever they may be and continue to learn wherever I can," she added.

Shannon made such rapid progress during her apprenticeship, and seized every opportunity to learn from the experienced Plant Technicians at Finning, that the amount of training she undertook was doubled and she fast-tracked her apprenticeship a year ahead of schedule.. She very quickly demonstrated exceptional technical knowledge, problem-solving skills, leadership and dedication to customer service, making a significant impact at Finning's Chesterfield branch.

Her peers identified her as a Trailblazer and a role model for other young women in the field, encouraging them to join Engineering Apprenticeships and pursue careers in this male-dominated industry. Shannon was nominated by several of her colleagues for the National Inspiring Women in Construction and Engineering Awards and during her apprenticeship, she took on the role of supporting other female Apprentices on the programme.

When the judging was being carried out for the Stars of the Future Awards 2024, Shannon's video statement was identified early on as being exceptional. She also won a Highly Commended accolade in the Plant Technician of the Year - Midlands category.

She said: "It was a complete shock when my name was announced as the winner of the Best Personal Statement, as I didn't realise it was a category you were automatically entered into. I was already thrilled to receive a Highly Commended in another category, so was elated to win in another.

"In December I get the amazing opportunity to go to Berlin as part of my prize. I'm excited to go on the Wolfffran factory tour with Dave Holder, European Operations Director of Wolffkran, and I'll even get the chance to go sightseeing and around the Berlin Christmas Markets."

SPOTLIGHT ON TOM WILLIAMS WINNER OF THE JUDGES' SPECIAL AWARD 2024



Tom Williams not only won the Plant Technician of the Year Award for the Welsh region at Stars of the Future, he was also a very worthy winner of the Judges' Special Award. The judges were highly impressed with Tom's vlog, where he spoke very openly and honestly about overcoming mental health issues.

Tom first started his apprenticeship in conjunction with Bridgend College back in 2016 when he was 16 years old. At the time, he was mainly working on agricultural equipment, before he moved to a company where he was able to work on a variety of plant.

He said: "Towards the latter part of my Level 2 qualification, I started to struggle with my mental health. I found it difficult to complete the qualification, but did manage to gain the certification just before the company I was working for went into administration. It was a tough time and I decided that I was going to take a break from college to try and get myself better mentally and get back on track."

Tom took some time out to concentrate on improving his mental health before he began searching for suitable employment to allow him to progress with a Level 3 qualification. However, his hopes were dashed as COVID hit. Rather than taking on employees, most plant companies were furloughing them.

Again, showing strength of character he wasn't deterred. He took several jobs on the periphery of the plant industry to ensure that he was in the correct environment to be able to try for suitable employment as soon as the opportunities started to arise.

Once this was the case he was able to return to the industry he loves, initially with Centregreat where he progressed well and became a respected member of the maintenance team. However, a lot of his time was taken up working on roadgoing vehicles rather than plant. It was then that he managed to secure his position with CBL. From here he has flourished. 'THE JUDGES WERE HIGHLY IMPRESSED WITH TOM'S VLOG, WHERE HE SPOKE VERY OPENLY AND HONESTLY ABOUT OVERCOMING MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES.'

Tom joined the cohort at Bridgend College after strong relationships had already been forged by his peers, as all his fellow students had studied at Level 2 together. But due to his cheerful manner and can-do attitude, he soon built strong relationships and became one of the most influential members of the team.

Tom said: "After around four months of being with CBL, I was offered the role of a Standby Mobile Engineer. This made me even more determined to finish my Level 3 qualification early and push myself forward to becoming the Main Mobile Engineer. I was even studying wiring and hydraulic diagrams in my spare time to try and give me an upper hand. This was one of my weaknesses but it soon turned into one of my strengths.

"Having completed my qualification early, I was shortly offered the Main Mobile Engineer role. I'm so happy with how far I have come and how much self-discipline I've had. I absolutely love my job and it only wants me to drive on and see how much I can achieve in my career."

Tom's next goal is become the Foreman at CBL but eventually he would love to work his way up to Depot Manager. We wish you the very best of luck Tom!
